VISIT OF MRS “GENERAL” BOOTH

Friday last was a great day in the history of the Salvation Army in Potton, for on that day Mrs. “General” Booth paid a visit to the town on her motor campaign. Accompanied by her staff in several motor cars, Mrs Booth arrived about 3.30 and was met by the Salvation Army Band and proceeded to the Congregational Church, kindly lent for the occasion, where a large congregation had already assembled, who with the crowd outside, gave the party a right royal welcome. The meeting, which was presided over by Mr F. W. Braybrooks, J.P. , who was supported on the platform by a number of local gentlemen of all denominations, was opened by the singing of the hymn “Christ for the world we sing”, was followed by the Rev J. Phelps reading a portion of scripture after which Major Gault offered a most earnest prayer. Mrs Booth whose subject was “Present Day Problems from the Salvation Army point of view”, is a gifted speaker, possessed with a charming delivery, and held her audience’s rapt attention whilst she dealt in a clear and concise manner with her subject. She also traced the work of the Army from its humble beginnings to its present gigantic size, and the various spheres of work that they were engaged in. Votes of thanks and the singing of the “Doxology” and the National Anthem closed this interesting meeting. The party were entertained to tea by various townspeople and before their departure for Bedford, the band played on the Market Square and Major Gault gave an interesting account of his 17 years work in India. The party left about 6.30 to the strains of “God be with you till we meet again.”

Florence Eleanor Booth (née Soper; 12 Sept 1861 – 10 June 1957) was the wife of Bramwell Booth, 2nd General of The Salvation Army.

‘She was young, delicate, refined; her remarkable powers of grasp and administration had not been developed at this time; she was typical of the well-educated, rather shrinking and self-conscious girl of the English professional classes — perhaps the last person in the world to whom any one would have thought of committing so hazardous and dreadful a business as this rescuing of fallen women. But she was moved by her husband's appeal, and, in spite of some doubt on William Booth's part, was appointed to take charge of the Salvation Army's first Rescue Home’
